



Cà Maiol wines are from the Lugana and Valtènesi areas, in Northern Italy. The estate comprises 130 hectares of land located on the southern shore of Lake Garda.

Cà Maiol takes its name from the Cascina Maiolo, a structure at the winery that dates back to 1710.

Chiaretto Valtènesi Riviera del Garda D.O.P.

Chiaretto is an Italian word for rosé.
Ca'Maiol Chiaretto is referred to as a 'rosé d'une nuit', or 'rosé of one night' in which the maceration is short, as the four grapes have skin contact with the must for only one night. This crisp and fresh wine, crafted in the Lake Garda region, is a blend based on Groppello, Marzemino, Barbera and Sangiovese grapes.

Lugana D.O.P.



Lugana takes its name from an Italian district, south of Lake Garda in the Lombardy region, and the Trebbiano di Lugana grape.

This wine is a gentle combination of smoothness and tartness, where apple and pea aromas are framed by citrus fruits.



Giomè Benaco Bresciano I.G.P.

'Giomè' is reminiscent of the Ancient Roman word *Giomelle*, which means "the union of two things". Giomè represents the union of two elements: the Groppello grape, indigenous to Lake Garda, and a blend made up of Marzemino, Barbera and Sangiovese varieties.

This characterful red blend is lively and spicy and originates in the Lake Garda region.

Molin Lugana D.O.P.

Lugana 'Molin' takes its name from the historical vineyard located just outside the cellar doors and is produced with a selection of the oldest vines from the estate. This wine exhibits aromas of exotic tropical fruits and almonds. The Trebbiano di Lugana grape is also called Turbiana in local dialect and is genetically the same as Italy's celebrated Verdicchio varietal.
